 - a. A copy of your high school transcript.
 - b. A minimum of two letters of recommendation from a teacher, counselor, mentor, employer, etc.

Letters of Recommendation:

One letter of recommendation MUST be from an an individual that you have interacted with in your CTE studies such as an OSTC teacher or counselor, high school CTE teacher, work/work study employer, CTE club/activity team leader/mentor, etc.

The other letter MUST be from someone who knows you in another capacity. You can attach the letters to your application or they can be sent directly to andrea.berry@osedfoundation.org

Scholarships will be awarded on the basis of the information provided in the application, including essay questions, letters of

recommendation and CTE interest and involvement.
